It is a Fast like the other three fasting periods of the year, from meat and dairy products, from excessive eating and drinking, from idleness and self indulgence and FOR PRAYER, FOR ALMSGIVING, FOR REPENTANCE. The Dormition Fast prepares us to celebrate the great sign of the Theotokos's Falling Asleep, the promise of our own Eternal Life in Body, Soul and Spirit if we do as She has done, hear, ponder and do the Will of God in our lives. The fasting from and the doing for TOGETHER enable us to better fulfill the Lord's Will in our lives, clearing out the weeds and planting new seeds of life in the garden of our spirit, soul and body.
