## The 8<sup>th</sup> Day of December Commemoration of our Venerable Father Patápius of Thebes.

## **Evening Service**

### At "Lord, I call...," 3 stikhera, in Tone 1: Special melody "O all-praised martyrs...."

O father Patápius /

Having quenched the flaming desires of the flesh with <u>ab</u>stinence / Thou didst <u>go</u> and make thine abode in the desert like <u>Elij</u>ah of old, / Cleansing thy mind with <u>cease</u>less <u>prayer</u> to God. /// Beseech Him now to grant our souls peace and great mercy.

#### O father Patápius /

Having adorned thyself with dispassion, / Thou didst number thyself with the ranks of ascetics; / And dwelling with them now in the mansions of the righteous, / In the presence of the never-waning Light and the Tree of Life. /// Beseech Christ to grant our souls peace and great mercy.

#### O father Patápius /

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Thou didst shine forth like a lamp from the Land of <u>Egypt</u> / Enlightening all under the sun with the brightness of thy <u>miracles</u>, / Dispelling the darkness of soul-cor<u>rupting</u> in<u>firmities</u> / And driving a<u>way</u> great multitudes of <u>demons</u>. /// Beseech Christ to grant our souls peace and great <u>mer</u>cy.

# Note: But if we sing "Alleluia" at the Morning Service instead of "God is the Lord," then the following 3 stikhera to the Theotokos are sung at the Evening Service, at "Lord I call," before the above stikhera of the saint, in the same tone and melody:

Without cor<u>rup</u>tion, thou gavest <u>birth</u> to God / Who took on our <u>hu</u>man flesh / Pouring <u>forth</u> upon it incor<u>rup</u>tion / O most-<u>pure</u> and incor<u>rup</u>tible one. / <u>There</u>fore I be<u>seech</u> thee: / Renew me through thy <u>prayers</u>, O <u>pure</u> one, / Though I am <u>rid</u>dled with the sores of cor<u>rup</u>tion / That with love I may ever <u>praise</u> and <u>glo</u>rify thee /// Who raised on-high our human race.

We be<u>seech</u> thee, all-praised <u>La</u>dy, / The hope and confirmation of all the <u>faith</u>ful, /

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Our <u>ref</u>uge and our <u>helper</u>: /

Preserve us, thy servants from <u>every calamity</u>, / Who with <u>faith</u> worship Him Who was <u>born</u> of thee. /// Pray to Christ that He grant our souls peace and great <u>mercy</u>.

Oh, woe is me, what shall I do? / My mind and soul and body are polluted by my transgressions; / What can I do to avoid the unquenchable flames and the eternal bonds? / But do thou help me, O all-pure one /// Before the end, beseech thy Son to grant unto me the remission [of my sins].

## Glory... now and ever..., Theotokion, in the Same Tone and melody:

Thou didst bear <u>Christ</u>, the Fire of Divinity, with<u>in</u> thy womb, / O all-<u>pure</u> one. / Now be<u>seech</u> Him to extinguish the smoldering embers of my <u>pass</u>ions / And deliver me <u>from</u> the <u>eter</u>nal flames, /// And grant me the brightness of the righteous when He shall come to <u>judge</u> all things.

## Or the Stavrotheotokion:

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As she be<u>hel</u>d her Lamb up<u>on</u> the Cross, / Bereft of form or <u>come</u>liness, / The un<u>blem</u>ished Ewe-lamb, the sovereign Lady, cried la<u>men</u>ting: / Woe is me! Where <u>hath Thy beauty fled?</u> / Where is Thy <u>splen</u>dor, O most <u>Sweet</u> One? /// Where is the radiant grace of Thine image, O my most be<u>lovèd Son?</u>

Or Dogmatic Theotokion if a Resurrection service.

## The Troparion for the Saint, in Tone 8:

The image of God was truly preserved in thee, O <u>Fa</u>ther, / For thou didst take up thy cross and <u>fol</u>low Christ / By so doing thou didst teach us to disregard the flesh, for it <u>passes</u> away / But to care instead for the soul, since it is im<u>mor</u>tal /// Therefore thy spirit, O holy Patapius, rejoices with the <u>ang</u>els.
