Annual Advent Retreat: **Saturday, December 3rd 9:30am to 2:30pm**, followed by Confessions and Vespers at 4pm. Topic is The Healing Agony of Forgiveness. Presenter: Fr. Martin Browne. As we prepare to celebrate "peace on earth, good will to men" we often find ourselves struggling with forgiveness – giving and receiving. Join us for a practical approach to forgiveness, borne of the experience of unjust hurt and the challenge of forgiving. What does it mean to forgive? How do I forgive? Why should I forgive?
