

CAMPUS MISSIONARY INITIATIVE

One year ago, OCF launched its pilot Campus Missionary location, placing a full-time staff member on campus at Texas A&M University. Student participation and engagement were beyond our expectations. Highlights included:

- 100+ student participants
- 110+ hours of one-on-one student discipleship
- 7 different breakout groups meeting regularly
- 1/3 of participants a PDF Viewer b Orthodoxy

Two new locations launched this year, at Arizona State University and in Atlanta (serving Georgia Tech, Emory, and local students). Our heartfelt dream is continued expansion to more locations in years to come.

FAITH, FELLOWSHIP & FORMATION

STUDENTS GROWING CLOSER IN CHRIST

During the 2023-24 school year, over 700 student participants attended a retreat, conference, or other OCF-hosted event, including:

- 7 regional weekend retreats
- 2 College Conferences (East & Midwest)
- Summer Leadership Institute
- Real Break

Events were led by OCF Staff alongside prominent Orthodox speakers including bishops, priests, and lay individuals.

To keep student registration fees affordable and provide scholarships for students in need of financial assistance, OCF raises over \$100,000 to help underwrite annual program expenses.



How is OCF Serving College Students?

With a presence on over 250 campuses, a wide range of local, regional, and national programming, and the most exciting effort in recent campus ministry history, the Campus Missionary Initiative, OCF is more present and engaged with college students than ever, keeping them close to Christ and the Orthodox Faith during their time in school.

SUMMER LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE

SLI is a seven-day summer leadership training program designed to help college students understand what it means to be a young Orthodox leader in OCF, the Church, and the world.

COLLEGE CONFERENCE

College Conference hosts hundreds of students annually for faith education and fellowship. The program takes place from December 27-30th, in two locations: East at Antiochian Village in Bolivar, Pennsylvania, and Midwest at St. lakovos Retreat Center in Kansasville, Wisconsin.

REAL BREAK

Real Break provides college students with the opportunity to engage the Orthodox faith through trips of pilgrimage and service. Students travel during spring and summer breaks to participate in the work of the Church alongside the ministries, monasteries, parishes, and people of each host city.


