

Docetism: Christ was a phantasm and was not actually a physical

being, thus His death on the cross was an illusion too.



Monophysitism: Christ had only one nature (Divine) which subsumed the human nature



Modal Monarchianism: God is singular and wore the mask of humanity while



Monothelitism: Christ had two natures but only



Apollinarianism: Christ had a human body and human emotions, but he had the nous of God.



Nestorianism: Christ was two persons combined, not one person with two natures.

God to become God at some point during his physical existence. Also known as Dynamic-



The Orthodox Teaching on the Dual Natures of Christ is very difficult to display on a chart. This

mystery of the Church states that Christ has a fully Divine Nature and a fully human nature, but He is a single Person. He is both God and man without confusion, without change, without division, without separation. Both natures remain intact while existing in one Person, that of the Second Person of the Holy Trinity.
